An illustrated feature highlights how escalating



## TECHNOLOGY WITH HUMANITY: MACRON'S CALL FOR AN INCLUSIVE AI ORDER

Emmanuel Macron urged global leaders to shape artificial intelligence with shared rules and human values, warning against fragmented governance. Speaking at the AI summit, he framed innovation as inseparable from responsibility. Macron emphasised collaboration among democracies to prevent technological dominance by a few actors. His pitch centred on inclusivity, ethics, and transparent regulation rather than unchecked acceleration. As AI systems grow more powerful, he argued, legitimacy will depend on trust. The message was clear: technological leadership must be anchored in collective norms, not unilateral ambition.

## PERFORMANCE MEETS EFFICIENCY IN NOTHING'S NEW LINE

Nothing confirmed that its Phone series will run on a Snapdragon processor, focusing on balanced performance and efficiency. The decision signals a move toward reliability rather than experimental hardware. Analysts expect smoother multitasking and improved power management. In a competitive market, processor choice often defines user experience more than aesthetics. Nothing appears to be consolidating its identity around thoughtful engineering. The emphasis is less on spectacle and more on sustainable performance.



## FROM COAST TO CODE: A NEW AI GEOGRAPHY

Sundar Pichai remarked that he never imagined Visakhapatnam would emerge as a global AI hub. His comments reflect the decentralisation of technology ecosystems beyond traditional metros. Investment, talent, and policy support are enabling new cities to claim digital relevance. The statement carries symbolic weight: innovation is no longer confined to established corridors. As infrastructure expands, regional hubs may redefine India's technology map.

## SCREEN SCALE: XIAOMI EXPANDS PREMIUM DISPLAY LINE

Xiaomi has launched a large-format QLED television in India, targeting consumers seeking immersive home entertainment. The model emphasises display clarity, smart integration, and competitive pricing. As streaming grows, hardware manufacturers are betting on cinematic living-room experiences. The release signals continued demand for premium screens despite market saturation. In consumer electronics, incremental improvement often drives sustained interest.





## AI BEYOND BILLIONAIRES: A UNITED NATIONS WARNING

**A**ntónio Guterres cautioned that artificial intelligence must not be controlled by the whims of a few billionaires. He called for multilateral oversight to ensure equitable access and ethical safeguards. Guterres framed AI governance as a matter of global justice, not merely innovation policy. Concentrated power, he warned, risks widening inequality. His remarks reinforced demands for inclusive frameworks that prioritise humanity over market dominance. The appeal underscored a growing consensus: AI's trajectory must be shaped collectively, not privately.

## CONTROVERSY ALTERS THE AI SUMMIT STAGE

**B**ill Gates withdrew from delivering a keynote address at the AI Summit amid controversy. Organisers acknowledged the development while reaffirming the event's broader agenda. While the summit proceeded, the withdrawal shifted media focus. In technology forums, credibility often extends beyond innovation to the individuals representing it.

Funding decisions now shape not only technology trajectories but geopolitical alignments.

Vivo has introduced the V series models in India, focusing on camera capability and sleek design. Positioned within the competitive mid-range segment, the devices aim to balance affordability with premium features. Analysts note that differentiation increasingly hinges on photography and battery efficiency. The launch reflects sustained consumer appetite for incremental innovation. In a saturated market, consistency may outweigh radical redesign.

## FITNESS BEFORE FIREPOWER: DUBE'S QUIET REINVENTION

Shivam Dube credits disciplined fitness work for his growing impact at the T20 World Cup. Often judged for power-hitting alone, Dube says conditioning has sharpened mobility, endurance, and shot selection under pressure. The transformation reflects a broader shift in Indian cricket, where physical readiness underpins consistency. His recent performances suggest confidence born of preparation rather than impulse. The challenge lies in balancing flair with responsibility. For Brevis, growth now means patience and purpose. Establishing a personal cricketing language may take time, but intent is evident. In elite sport, self-definition often proves the hardest milestone to reach.

Australia's women produced a composed all-round performance to defeat India by a narrow margin in the second T20I, squaring the series. Batting depth set the platform before disciplined bowling applied pressure late. India showed resilience but fell short in key moments. The result underlines fine margins at the highest level. For both sides, adjustments now become critical. Series contests often hinge on momentum shifts, and Australia's response restored balance and belief heading into the decider.

### CHEF'S CORNER


### Instructions:

6. Serve hot with dip or inside pita bread.

**Chef's Tip:** Do not over-grind the chickpeas; a coarse texture keeps falafel crisp.

# Ramadan and the Rise of Night-Time Commerce

Ramadan is traditionally known as a month of fasting, prayer, and spiritual reflection. Yet beyond its religious significance, it also reshapes economic rhythms across many Muslim-majority societies. One of the most striking transformations during this month is the rise of night-time commerce. - Rise of pop-up bazaars and seasonal stalls
- Tourism and hotel occupancy linked to Ramadan events

These patterns demonstrate that spiritual observance coexists with economic vibrancy.
